Under 8s defeated St Bernadettes (Tigers) 3-1 at Phillips Park:

the opponents from levelling the score. Andrew snared his second goal of the match and shortly after assisted James in securing his first hat-trick. After several close attempts, Mitchell Djelevski scored the final two goals of the match

In the end this was a hard fought, but well deserved win with Lidcombe showing plenty of team spirit.

With Guildford now having to play Coptic (surprise winners over the Zimwarriors in the minor semi-final) in the final, a rematch against Guildford in the grand final now looks the most likely outcome
