Secretary's Report

The 2006 season has been successful and enlightening with players and officials having an enjoyable year. Saturday mornings at Phillips Park were always a buzz when the teams were playing at home. It was a pleasure to attend games where Lidcombe was playing and to see the great support that followed all teams from Under 6 to First Grade. Not only was it pleasing to see the number of supporters at games but it also made me proud to be the Secretary of Lidcombe Churches because of the great behaviour displayed by all supporters of the Congs.

The season would not be possible without the commitment and dedication of the Coaches and Managers. Thanks to all of the following people who helped out with teams this season; Ben Williamson, Frankie Tassone, John Williamson, David Whitwell, Jack Dutton, William Wilbow, Katie Rush, Julie Rush, Michael Rush, Kieran O'Hara, Ken James, Tony Houhlias, Sam Sterland, John Hawach, Steven May, Sam Annous, Natasha Conneely, Stan Gad, Scott Ashbrooke and Alex Morozoff.

Helping out with a team is a very rewarding activity and I encourage everyone to consider what you can do to help, no matter how small.

This year there was (on more than one occasion and in more than one team) a severe shortage of transport to get junior players to away matches and as a result one match had to be forfeited. Next year the responsibility for getting to away games will rest with individual parents and players. You will be given the time to meet at the field where you are playing and it will be up to you to ensure that transport.

This season we had nine junior teams that comprised of 132 registered players. The senior squad, of 32 registered players, once again played in the Premier League Division and had a strong finish to the season.

The cost of running the club increased this season dramatically mainly in the form of player registration and insurance charged to us by the N.S.W Churches Football Association. Our committee believes that we should keep the cost of player registration to a bare minimum however we cannot run at a loss and next season we will have no choice but to pass on these increases to cover costs.

Other major expenditures that we have are the Presentation Day and purchase of equipment. Income raised through the canteen and fundraising go directly to cover costs. It is very fortunate that we have volunteers that organise these major club activities. Thanks to Alex Morozoff for co-ordinating the canteen's activities and to all the people who took time out of their Saturday morning to volunteer their time in helping with the smooth running of the canteen. Michelle and Ben Williamson once again headed the fundraising efforts with their successful Krispy Kreme drive and World Cup raffle. Without the efforts of these volunteers taking time out of their very busy schedules to organise these activities our club would not be able to afford the basics such as balls and trophies.

Other people that made life easier on Saturday mornings were our club referees who controlled matches when official referees were not provided by the Association. Referee courses are available to participate in for both mini and full field matches and I encourage everyone to participate even if it is just to gain the knowledge of the laws of the game.

- Mitchell Starc played his 200th match against Castle Hill Baptists at Everley Park in June.
- Five players joined the Honour Roll this season when they played their 100th club game. They were: Reece Raper (P/L), Jorge Salamo (P/L), Moufid Hawach (U/12), Fadi Annous (U/15) and Patrick Conneely (P/L).



You be the Referee!

- Q.** A player takes a throw in from his own side of half way and throws it directly to a team mate who is standing in an offside position in the opposition half of the field.
- Decision.** **Law 11 – Offside**
Play on! A player shall not be declared offside if he receives the ball directly from a goal kick, throw-in or corner.
- Q.** A player shoots for goal and unfortunately for you as referee, the ball strikes you and crossed the line into the goals!
- Decision.** **As Referee (or Linesman for that matter) you are deemed part of the game if the ball strikes you and goals in you are to award A GOAL.**
- Q.** A player takes a corner kick, the ball hits the goalpost and bounces directly back to him without touching another player. He then kicks it again!
- Decision.** **A player MUST NOT play the ball a second time before it has been touched or played by another player. Indirect free kick against the offender where the infringement occurred.**
- Q.** The referee awards an INDIRECT free kick and the striker blasts the ball at the goal. It rebounds off you, the Referee, and goes straight into the net.
- Decision.** **Law 13 – Free Kicks**
No Goal. A goal can only be scored if it subsequently touches another player before it enters the goal.
Play is to be restarted by the awarding of a goal kick.
- Q.** The defending team receives a direct free-kick for handball inside their penalty area. The defender passes the ball to the goalkeeper who picks up the ball.
- Decision.** **Law 13 – Free Kicks**
Retake the kick! The ball is in play when it is kicked directly beyond the penalty area following a free kick taken by the defending team inside its own penalty area.
