# President's Report

- Q.** The goalkeeper after saving a shot, thinks that all opposition players have run back towards half way, drops the ball in front of himself ready to play on. When he realises that there is an opposition player behind him he picks the ball back up without any other player touching it.

**Decision.** **Law 12 – Fouls and Misconduct**  
**Award an indirect free kick to the attacking team! A goalkeeper may not touch the ball again with his hands after releasing it from his possession if it has not touched any other player (an opponent anywhere on the field or a team mate outside their defending penalty area).**

- Q.** Two players kick the match ball at the same time, it 'pops' and deflates.

**Decision.** **Stop the play, replace the ball and restart the match with a DROP BALL from where play was stoped.**

The players in the team were:

**FADI ANNOUS:** A versatile player - left midfield, right midfield, right back - wherever he is asked to play he plays and although he might not like it he always does it and does it well. Not gifted with speed or bountiful ability but knows when and where to pop up.

**SERCAN DEMIR:** The most consistent player all year with the "little general" the source of both attack and defence. Always back to help defend and win the ball and then turn around and be on attack. Held the midfield together well but needs to learn to talk more to those around him. Sercan has the ability to pick and choose when to pass and was always solid in a challenge, winning the ball on most occasions. Proved he can handle it with the big boys both in training with the all-age and when he played with them.

**AHMED ELCHEIKH:** Another good year for Ahmed. Solid, as always at the back, and equally adept when needed in goals. He does need to learn however to talk across the backs. Tends to rely too much on being able to chase down players rather than organising guys around him to handle it.

**ANGELA EKWENSI:** Angela had her first year with us and from first sight at training you could see she knew how to play. Very gifted player but like so many she tries to do too much at times when really a simple play would have served her better. She has all the ability at her feet but needs to remember

she has teammates around her. She started off the season on fire but halfway through (possibly straight after her 15 minutes of fame on television) she slackened off a lot. Probably should be playing at a higher standard but if she carried with her the little commitment she showed towards the end of the year she would not last long.

**STACEY EVANS:** The little “pitbull” never backed out of a challenge and put a few boys (most bigger than her) on their butts! Worked well with Sercan in the centre of midfield but, like him, needs to open her mouth and scream sometimes! Responds well to little hints from the sideline during the game, none more so than a game at Everley Park when she was asked “Are you going to do anything?” only to score a few seconds later! Only her first year with the club and with no women’s team and the Youth League just formed I am sure she would be up to playing in Second Grade next year.

**SALAHODDIN IQBAL:** Not the most gifted or fittest player but did show a lot of determination when he got a chance to play. Needs a swift kick at times to get him going and if he could get himself fitter could surprise a few in the long run.

**AMADEUS LOMBARDO:** Had a very strong first year for the club. Very capable defender but has tendencies to slide when not needed. Solid in the air but suspect at times on the ground. Given a couple of years he will make a handy sweeper in all age.

**TAKUDZWA MUKANDO:** Taku is another strong midfield player who had to play on the left a fair bit during the last part of the season. Strong in the air and capable on the ground he had a tendency to try to beat everyone on his own at the start of the year but midway through the season started playing a lot better when he moved the ball around. He was another who acquitted himself well playing in all-age when he finally showed some aggression to go with his size. Does have a tendency to appear lazy at times but when he is in the mood he does play well. If he could work more on his fitness he would be a handy player in second grade next year.

**ANDREW SEGECIC:** The nifty little striker, shorter than most but bigger in heart. Andrew could one day be a very good striker if he learnt to pick and choose when to pull out the old bag of tricks. No doubt he can beat an opposing player but when you try the same thing too many times you make it easy for them to predict your next move. Guilty on a few occasions of trying the hero move when simple gets better results. Remember “little one-twos create more chances than going for glory on your own”!

**JORGE SCHLACK:** The “giant” played up front all year and showed the value of height. Playing against older and bigger boys it was handy to have a striker as big as Jorge. Crosses, corners, set pieces, anything that came in the air he was a chance. Like his fellow striker he also tried too much when he did not need to. Another year together and possibly playing within their own age group and no doubt they will bag themselves lots of goals.

**FRANKIE TASSONE:** Started off as expected, causing havoc down the right wing and occasionally getting in some great crosses for the strikers. Handled himself well playing with the all-age causing the same havoc he did for his Youth side but disappeared towards the end of the year and left a gap to fill. Some advice for the future, Frankie! Don’t take on your mum – you’ll never win!

**ANDREW VOLPATO:** Has come a long way since I first coached him in the Under 6s. Very solid left back who is not afraid to use his body to stop the opposition. Seems to be maturing with age, reading the play and being able to get into position early. Reminds me of a former all-age left back Nigel Batts. Might not be blessed with a lot of skills but is able to do his job and do it well.
