

Decision. Law 11 – Offside

> Play on! A player shall not be declared offside if he receives the ball directly from a goal kick, throw-in or corner.

Q. A player shoots for goal and, unfortunately for you as referee, the ball strikes you and crosses the line into the goals!

Decision. As Referee (or Linesman for that matter) you are deemed to be part of the game and if the ball strikes you and deflects into the goals you are to award A GOAL.

Q. A player takes a corner kick; the ball hits the goalpost and bounces directly back to him without touching another player. He then kicks it again!

Decision. A player MUST NOT play the ball a second time before it has been touched or played by another player. Indirect free kick against the offender where the infringement occurred.






