

Billy played fantastic and even scored his first-ever goal. From then on he never looked back even breaking into the starting line up for the President's Cup and winning the Most Improved Player Award. Well done Billy on a fantastic season!!

Alex MALJEVAC: Another new player to the team who fitted in straight away. Alex played the majority of the season at either centre or right midfield where he would hustle for the ball and play it smartly up the field. Athavan NITHIANANTHAN: Started the season playing in defence and was playing well. Mid season he was moved to left midfield where he had the space to use his speed to full advantage. Artie is easily the fastest player in the competition when he gets his long stride going, he only needs to realise just how fast he is and start backing himself. He showed glimpses of how good he can be by being our best player at the President's Cup.

To all the Under 10s, thank you for your ENTHUSIASM, TEAM EFFORT and RESPECT you gave throughout the season. I hope that you continue to play soccer and be associated with the Congs.

The players in the team were:

Matthew AMURAO: Playing his first season of soccer Matthew took a few weeks to find his position at left fullback that gave him the confidence to play and be part of the team. He played 15 games and his stand-out performance was played against Guildford McCredie (Red). Matthew showed no fear in defending and attacking at this match.

NEW COACH LEADS BREAKTHROUGH!

 New Premier League coach PHIL McINTOSH seemed right at home when he took over the reins this season. Phil is a qualified referee and has controlled many of our club's games over the years. He was also a guest at last year's 70th Anniversary Dinner and obviously liked what he saw! So much so that he put his hand up for the vacant coaching position and was instrumental in the team's successes this season.



Ok all you budding Referees, Let's see how you go with these scenarios prepared by the Cong's own "Walking Rule Book"

Q. Playing at Phillips Park running down hill towards the B.B.Q in the second half Stephen James takes a goal kick that goes straight to brother Mathew who is, as usual, very slow

limping back into position and is just outside the opposition's penalty area, in an "off-side

position". Mat turns shoots and puts the ball in the back of the net.

Decision. Law 11 (Off-side).

There is no offside offence if a player receives the ball directly from a goal kick, a

throw-in or a corner.

Therefore you award a GOAL!

Q. A player shoots for goal and unfortunately for you as referee, the ball strikes you and

crossed the line into the gaols!

Decision. As Referee (or Linesman for that matter) you are deemed part of the game if the ball

strikes you and goals in you are to award A GOAL.

Q. A player takes a corner kick, the ball hits the goalpost and bounces directly back to him

without touching another player. He then kicks it again!

Decision. A player MUST NOT play the ball a second time before it has been touched or played

by another player. Indirect free kick against the offender where the infringement

occurred.

Q. The referee awards an INDIRECT free kick and the striker blasts the ball at the goal. It

rebounds off you, the Referee, and goes straight into the net.

Decision. Law 13 – Free Kicks

No Goal. A goal can only be scored if it subsequently touches another player before

it enters the goal.

Play is to be restarted by the awarding of a goal kick.

Q. The defending team receives a direct free-kick for handball inside their penalty area. The

defender passes the ball to the goalkeeper who picks up the ball.

Decision. Law 13 – Free Kicks

Retake the kick! The ball is in play when it is kicked directly beyond the penalty area

following a free kick taken by the defending team inside its own penalty area.
