PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Under 13s in Granville District Association

With team numbers dropping in the NSW Churches Football Association in the teenage age groups in recent years it was decided to nominate our Under 13s in the Granville Association competition. The side had a good first season finishing fourth after being defeated in extra time in the minor semi-final.

A number of clubs and teams previously playing in the Churches Association have transferred to the Granville Association and I believe this is where our club's future lies.

The Season in Review

The Under 6s coached by Michael Hawach turned around their previous season's results with a run of social match wins (and goals!) that promises well for the future.

Stephen's consistently brilliant performances for many years and his great 2011 season saw him win selection in the NSW Churches Football Association's Sydney team which played in and won the National Christian titles in New Zealand earlier this month.

All footballers who aspire to greater heights both with skills and sportsmanship need to look no further than these two 500 plus game players.

Again we were in the fortunate position of having people volunteer their time to help out with the running of the club. This year the committee has recognised the contribution that Trent Smith has made to the club. The players in the team were:

Talha AHMED: Very safe at the back in defence, kept to his position and used his big kick to get us out of trouble on many occasions and for his efforts he has been awarded the Most Consistent Player trophy. We certainly missed him in July when he had to travel overseas to visit his sick grandmother!

Edwin AKOL: There is no doubting Edwin's enthusiasm and he tried so hard to score, but just when you thought the ball would go in the back of the net his ball control would let him down. Did manage to score a nice goal in our 1–0 win over OLOR (Blue) at Phillips Park so we know he can do it and I'm sure dad will make sure he gets in plenty of practice over the summer months!

Arzycki DE VERA: A cool customer who could always be relied upon to do his best, both in attack and defence. YOU ARE THE REFEREE

Ok all you budding Referees, Let's see how you go with these scenarios prepared by the Cong's own "Walking Rule Book"

Q. 20.08.90: First Grade goalkeeper Tony Tannous takes a goal-kick and kicks it just outside the penalty area. He runs out and kicks the ball back into the penalty area and picks it up before any other player on the field touches it.

Decision. **Law 16 (The Goal Kick).**
The kicker must not play the ball again until it has been touched by another player.
If, after the ball is in play, the kicker touches the ball again before it has touched another player an indirect free kick is awarded to the opposing team, to be taken from the point where the infringement occurred.

Ok all you budding Referees, Let's see how you go with these scenarios prepared by the Cong's own "Walking Rule Book"

Q. A penalty has been awarded close to fulltime. The match has been extended to allow the taking of the penalty kick. The attacking player takes the kick and it hits the post and another attacker has run in and kicked the ball into the goal.

Decision. **Law 14 (The Penalty Kick).**
NO GOAL. The extension of playing time to take a penalty kick is only until the kick is completed. The kick is deemed complete if a goal is scored directly from the penalty kick or if the penalty kick is saved by the goalkeeper or is missed by the attacker taking the kick.

PREMIER LEAGUE

With last year's coach, Phil McIntosh, stepping down less than 48 hours before the commencement of the competition and with just 16 players available for the first round clash against St Matthews (A) we certainly started the season on the back foot.

Of course we could have been in even worse shape had not Steve May displayed tremendous club spirit by stepping into the coaching role at such short notice. He then backed this up by playing one and a half games in the first round just a couple of weeks after undergoing arthroscopic surgery on his knee (and against medical advice). Steve continued to put in a similar wholehearted effort throughout the season and was one of only two players, the other being Danny James, who was available for all 15 competition rounds. Steve also organised a couple of barbeques after training as well as the end-of-season Shoalhaven weekend.

That first round clash against St Matthews (A) saw the Reserves (with the help of quite a few of the First Graders) win 2-0 and the Firsts, after showing a fair bit of fight, going down narrowly 3-2 as the hot weather and player shortages took its toll. Mat James, after reaching 300 club goals in the Summer Competition, continued on his goal-scoring ways accounting for all four of Lidcombe's goals. Joe Maugeri, the youngest player in the squad, showed how keen he was, backing up for half a game in the Firsts after his initial game for the club in the Reserves.

Brett May notched up his 400th game for the club in the Summer competition. He continued to "put in" for the 2011 winter season and if, as appears to be the case, he is heading to the gentler pace of the lower grades in the Hills District next year he can look back on his long association with the club with satisfaction.

Fate really conspired against us in the early part of the season as we then had to front up against St Patricks – competition winners in both grades last year – and on a hot day on the wide open spaces of Jones Park with key players missing and just 19 players available we were well beaten in both grades.

Foz Ayash, after not having played for a few years, showed promise in his debut for the club in Reserves and was then talked into having another run in the Firsts. I don't think he ever fully recovered from this horror initiation as we only saw him spasmodically after that! Probably the only bright spot in the day's play was newcomer Adrian Martinez's first goal for the club!

Matters took a turn for the better after this with "Wanney" Kim and Max Prak bringing along five of their international student mates to the next training session. Louis Darmizin, Antoine Drovot, Emeric Buffet, Men ("Nixon") Cheapros and Neville Nip all proved to be more than handy players, but unfortunately by season's end, only Louis and Antoine were turning out for us on a regular basis, often helping out by playing in both games. Max also disappeared off the scene midway through the season.

With five extra players on the books we headed into the next round against the Macarthur WASPS – beaten grand finalists in First Grade in 2010 - in much better shape with 27 players available, resulting in improved performances by both sides, the Reserves unlucky to go down 1-0 and the Firsts winning a tense game in the wet 1-0, with Steve James making a big difference to our defence in his first appearance for the season and Emeric and Neville sharpening our attack with some aggressive running.

Up to this point Mat James had been playing pretty much a lone hand up front in attack with the Firsts missing two of last year's successful three-pronged "Mat attack," Mat Hyde yet to make an appearance because of an injury suffered in the pre-season and Mat Lane unavailable this year because of work commitments.

The very safe goalkeeping in the wet conditions by both our keepers, James "PC" May and Danny "Frank the Tank" James was a highlight of this round. PC continued to play steadily throughout the season for the Reserves and while the passing years may have diminished his pace the competitive streak still remains and he seems unstoppable in his march to 700 club games.

As for Danny he was a revelation in goals for the Firsts this year, pulling off many great saves, often coming well off the line to extinguish opposition attacking raids, and regularly putting us back on the front foot with his booming clearances. He was the only person to play all 15 games for the Firsts, made 10 appearances in the Reserves as well and his consistent high quality displays in goals throughout the season saw him deservedly awarded the Ray "Curly" James Memorial trophy for Best All Age Player. Danny reached his 400th game in the season's final game so it was a big season all round for Frank!

Following the victory over the WASPS the Firsts then came out and gave Wentworthville a nice old 4-0 touch up while the Reserves put in a spirited display before going down 2-0, but victory came at a cost for the Firsts because Neville Nip's "hammy" injury meant we didn't see him again while Adrian Martinez suffered an ankle injury which troubled him for the rest of the season.

For the Firsts, Trent "Angry" Smith scored a rare double in a typical energetic display with Mat James also netting twice. Trent, captaining the side this year, led from the front and played with his usual enthusiasm throughout the season despite being hampered by a troublesome achilles tendon.

Our season looked to be back on track after these back to back wins by the Firsts, but then came a couple of ordinary performances against Greystanes, losing 6-0 in Reserves and 5-0 in Firsts, but it must be said that Greystanes certainly had "on" days in both grades and we went a long way to reversing these results when we met again later in the season. Vince Hui had one of those days, scoring a nice goal (for the opposition!), but apart from this he played steadily throughout the season in the Reserves. About the only good news on the day was the return of last season's leading goal scorer, Mat Hyde, enthusiastic as always, but obviously in need of a gallop or two.

While Mat did not score in his first game back he made amends for it the following week against St Matthews (B) scoring the Reserve's only goal in their 3-1 loss and then netting the winner for the Firsts after coming on as a substitute. His disrupted start to the season meant he never attained the fitness of last year, but he certainly hadn't lost his ability to sniff out a goal as demonstrated by his final tally of nine goals in nine first grade games.

Peter Oberemok sustained a broken wrist in the first half against St Matthews (B) but in typical fashion stayed out on the field until the final whistle. Obo was having a good season up until then and the Firsts certainly missed his contribution for the rest of the season. When he presented to hospital next day for treatment they were apparently amazed that he had played on after the injury. "Silly old bugger, should know better" was about the only sympathy he got from Linda!

Mat Hyde was at it again the following week against St Matthews (A) when he scored for the Reserves not long after coming on as a second half replacement and then backed this up by scoring two first half goals in the main game. The Reserves were finishing much the better in their game, but an unfortunate late goal conceded off a corner saw them go down 2-1.

The Firsts played some great footy in the first half grabbing a 2-0 lead before a very lucky goal off a rebounded Lidcombe clearance and then another goal scored on the stroke of half time saw St Matthews level up 2-2 at the break. The second half was a very evenly contested affair, but a rare Danny James fumble and then what appeared to be glaringly offside goal saw St Matthews finish 4-2 up.

The next round saw us playing St Patricks again and this time with players to spare both sides put in much improved performances. After being 3-0 down at half time, the

Reserves had St Patricks clearly rattled in the second half scoring three unanswered goals to share the points. Foz Ayash showed what might have been had we seen more of him, scoring twice, while Wanney finally lived up to his promise by scoring his first goal for the club.

The Firsts went down 3-2 after giving St Patricks a bit of a fright with goals to Mat James and Tristram Larwood. "Trixie" certainly plays the game with great passion and this goal was fitting reward for his efforts throughout the year. He is one player who certainly knows the value of "talking it up."

Mat James suffered ankle ligament damage which troubled him for a few weeks and eventually caused him to miss a game through injury, a very rare occurrence over his long career with the club. He played on after getting hurt, but eventually had to put his hand up to be replaced despite advice from the missus to "harden up." Rumour has it that she is now adding a teaspoon of concrete to his corn flakes each morning!

In the same game, Adrian Martinez was pole-axed by a very crude St Pats challenge and then suffered the indignity of being sent off for his verbal reaction to the tackle. His subsequent suspension meant we didn't see much more of him on the field before he took off for a visit back home to South America towards the end of the season.

The following week we made the annual trek to Camden for our rematch against the WASPS and while we could only muster 20 players the Reserves broke through with a well deserved 2-1 win, thanks to a well taken goal by Kieran Hines and Antoine Drovet's first goal for the club following a very determined run. Shane Mercer, knowing we were struggling for numbers, took a few hours break from work and travelled all the way from the City to play in the Reserves, dashing off straight after the game to get back before he was missed. Onya, Shayno!

The Firsts withstood a lot of pressure from the WASPS to share the points in a 1-1 draw. Mat James, playing despite his ankle ligament damage, "dicky" knee etc., surprised the WASPS' keeper with an angled shot from way out on the left, while Dave Hay led the way in defence, showing surprising pace to run down a tearaway WASPS' striker. A couple of saves by Danny late in the game had even the opposition keeper applauding.

The Firsts' next game against Wentworthville at Freame was most disappointing. We were never in the game and lucky to lose by only four goals and with this loss any hope of making the semis disappeared. We just didn't go in with the right attitude in this game. On a brighter note, the Reserves battled it out all the way against third- placed Wenty only to lose 3-2 in the last few minutes after conceding a very soft goal off a corner, our goals coming from Mat Lane (in his only appearance for the season) and Louis Darmizin.

Fortunately, the First's display against Wentworthville proved to be a bit of an aberration as they bounced back against Greystanes the following week, grabbing a shock 3-0 lead at half time through a Mat Hyde hat trick and looking well in control. However the second half was a different story as, with eight of the players having already participated in the early game, we tired noticeably and had to settle for a draw. Even then, "Hydie" could have won it for us in the last few minutes, but blasted it over the top with just the keeper to beat.

With the help of the first graders, the Reserves well and truly reversed their 6-0 first round loss, inflicting a 2-1 defeat on a Greystanes side which was riding high in the competition ladder thanks to a Kieran Hines' strike from well outside the box and a Steve James overhead scissors kick.

The following week against St Matthews (B) at Greenup was a real letdown. With just 17 players available due to injuries, suspensions and for other reasons, we lost both games against fairly substandard opposition whom we would have surely beaten with a full complement of players.

Our cause wasn't helped by Aaron "Harry" Sivasothy sacking himself in the second half of Firsts after deciding he wasn't playing well enough. Only problem was that there was

no one on the bench except an injured Adrian Martinez. Up to this point Harry was having one of his best seasons and, to his credit, he acknowledged his mistake at the next training session and apologised.

Robbie Hastings showed great club spirit, playing strongly in both games, while Tito Tealdo and Steve May also spent most of the afternoon out on the field. Quite a few of the others also played at least a game and a half, including Shane Mercer who surprised us all by lasting until half time in the Firsts no doubt trying to impress the missus and kids who were watching on, and Danny Huynh who volunteered to stay for the second half in Firsts despite having work commitments. Even an injured Adrian Martinez came on to replace Harry, but I don't think we will try him as keeper again!

Tito was supposed to leave after the Reserves due to other commitments (I think he was meant to get the car back to mum straight after the Reserves!), but he ended up staying to the end, playing strongly in both games. Based on his efforts and attitude on the day it was no surprise to see him awarded the WJ (Bill) Stevens Trophy for Most Consistent Reserve Grader.

The next week (a deferred first-round clash against St Columbas at Phillips) saw the Reserves always struggling in their 4–1 loss with two penalty goals conceded by us not helping our cause and things did not look any brighter for the Firsts when they trailed 2–0 at half time, one of those goals coming via a tremendous shot (at the wrong end) by “Angry” which gave Danny James no chance!

However in a memorable second half display with Steve James pushing up in attack from midfield and with the two Mats (Hyde and James) causing havoc up front with their pace, the goals came thick and fast resulting in Lidcombe running out easy 5–2 winners over a shell-shocked St Columbas. A hat trick to Mat Hyde, a goal to Mat James and an own-goal by the opposition rounded off the scoring.

This match marked Mat James' 500th club game and came on top of him reaching 300 club goals earlier in the year, just the third player to do so after Obo and Mat's brother, Steve. These days, his “dicky” left knee causes him a fair bit of bother, but when he is running freely there is still no more dangerous forward in the NSW Churches, with that pace off the mark catching many an opposing defender unawares. How many times have we seen him in and behind defenders before they know anything about it!

In the next round we again met St Columbas at Eric Mobbs and the Reserves improved on their previous encounter losing narrowly to a penalty goal and only after asking quite a few questions of the opposition defence. Kieran Hines, after playing with a lot more maturity this season, disappointed by getting himself foolishly (and needlessly) sent off. The Firsts, despite missing a few players, really had the opposition under the pump in the first half with Mat James' pace causing huge problems and our 2–0 lead at the break courtesy of two fine goals from Mat was well deserved. However with that “dicky” knee slowing him down and with other players tiring because of having to back up, the momentum of the game changed and we had to settle for a draw although we probably still should have won except for some fairly ordinary refereeing. Jurez Sivasothy, backing up from Reserves, had one of his best games of the season and his willingness to go on the “back of the card” for the First Grade most weeks was certainly appreciated.

The final round saw us playing Wentworthville again and Lidcombe finished off the season in fine style with wins in both grades. With the help of a few first graders the Reserves accounted for fourth-placed Wenty 3-1, goals coming from a booming Brett May left footer before half time and two second half goals by Steve James.

The Firsts made up for their disappointing effort in their previous encounter against Wentworthville, winning 1–0 and denying Wenty a place in the major semi final the following week. Trent Smith scored the winning goal from near the side line which completely deceived the opposition goalkeeper, but there is some argument as to whether it was a shot or a misdirected cross!
