# Harry Luland and Ron Turnbull (Snr)

The club lost two great Congos in 2017 with the passing of Harry Luland and Ron Turnbull (Senior).

When the Congs Soccer Club was reformed in the early sixties Ron's three sons, Ray, Ron and Ian became long term players for the club and Ron himself frequently took part in managers' and coaches matches.

Always the gentleman church elder Ron was instrumental in forming Congregational Church youth clubs in the '60s catering for the many teenagers of the suburb.

Along with wife Joyce, Ron was a regular sideline supporter attending many Congs matches at Wyatt and Phillips Park and both were guests at the club's Anniversary Dinner in 1979.

# President's Report

Despite a disrupted start to the season with council ground closures due to the wet weather resulting in all teams being unable to train or play trial games before the first competition game, the club has gone on to experience another successful season.

The club fielded 14 teams this year, an increase of three teams over 2016 and included a ladies team, the first since 1983. The formation of the ladies team was due mainly to the untiring efforts of Donna Batchelor (assisted by

Steve May) and while the ladies found the going tough against some pretty hot opposition, we hope to see them all back next season.

In the Churches Football Association (CFA), competition successes came by way of our Raahauge Cup First Grade team (Competition Grand Final winners) and our Under 9s (Competition Winners and President Cup Grand Final winners, while our Under 12s won their Grand Final in the Granville and District Soccer Football Association (GDSFA).

By way of explanation, in the CFA senior competitions, Grand Final winners are crowned Competition Winners, while in the juniors the Competition Winner is the team with the most points after the completion of both rounds (first past the post) with the top four teams then also playing off in another competition, the President's Cup. The GDSFA Competition Winner is the team winning the Grand Final decided after a finals series involving the top four teams.

Our Under 11 Gold (President's Cup grand finalists), Under 8s and Under 11 Blue (both President's Cup semi-finalists) and our Under 16s (GDSFA semi-finalists) also put in sound performances this season. It was also encouraging to see 13 of last year's Congo Kickers progressing to either our Under 6s or Under 7s which saw the club able to field three "mini" teams this year.

A pleasing feature of the Raahauge Cup First Grade's success was that six of the team had come up through our juniors. Teenagers, Jayden Hughes, Daniel Kratz and Chris May (one of our youngest ever first-graders) and Steve James, Mathew James and Trent Smith, all of whom have played more than 600 games for the club.

Of course, with the fielding of additional teams this year came the need for more coaches and managers and the club is highly appreciative of all those people who stepped in to help. I don't think a lot of people realise the time and effort involved with these positions, with training one night a week and then a large part of Saturday mornings taken up at games.

A major disappointment to me over the past couple of years has been the lack of courtesy shown by some parents in failing to advise coaches when their children were unavailable for games. Not only is this disrespectful to the coaches, but it doesn't set a good example to their children about reliability and meeting commitments.

My thanks to all those people who assisted with the running of the club, with special mention of the efforts of hardworking secretary, Steve May (and wife, Donna) throughout the season, and the contributions made to the smooth running of the club each Saturday by Lorraine, Paul and Amanda Kratz, John Mylonas, Trent Smith, and James, Patrick and Chris May.
