### RESULTS OF MATCHES PLAYED SATURDAY 30TH JUNE

#### Under 6's lost 0-1 to Guildford McCredie Uniting (White) at Everley Park

What a difference having substitutes at an away match makes!

This week the Under 6 team went on the road to Everley Park to play against Guildford McCredie (White). Having lost to this Guildford team when we played them in the trial match and during the season at Phillips Park, it was always going to be a tough match. However, with 2 substitutes and a desire to play well as a team, the Lidcombe team were full of energy, passing and tackling for the whole match. In fact, despite the loss, this was by far the best performance of the Lidcombe team so far this season.

Our team was able to consistently clear the ball to the side in defence and pass the ball up the field from goal kicks. With few and far chances coming for both teams in the match, Guildford's best chance actually came in the first half when our defenders attempt to clear the ball was intercepted by one of their players. He dribbled around our defenders and kicked the ball hard, only to have it stopped on the goal line by a well-positioned Mackenzie. The match remained scoreless leading into half time when the Coach challenged the Lidcombe team to play better than they did in the first half. Somehow, they managed to do just that with players listening very well to their positions and roles by trusting their fellow team mates who were defending to get the ball and pass it up the field to them. The score was 0-1 to Guildford after a cleverly taken coaches free kick just outside our box which was awarded due to our goal keeper picking up the ball when it was slightly outside of the circle (very unlike Sneh, probably just the pressure and excitement of the match).

Being a very defensive game, our best chance actually game in the dying seconds of the match. Lidcombe had a goal kick with 30 seconds remaining. Sneh placed the ball on the right side of the circle and passed it to Zachary, unmarked on the left side of the field. Zachary then started to dribble up the left side when the Guildford defenders came across and he had nowhere to go. Zachary then passed it to Rithul, whose very quick dribbling skills were not enough to run across the field and around the Guildford team. He was tackled around half way and the final whistle went, 0-1 loss for Lidcombe, but the result did not reflect the team's effort.
