Going into this game the Lidcombe U12 team had already secured a semifinal spot, the question to be resolved in this match was the team's ultimate placing on the competition points table. From this would be determined which semifinal opponent they would play. As Newington was/is on equal competition points (same win/draw/loss record) it came down to which team (Newington or Lidcombe) would end up with the better goal difference statistic (goals for vs goals against) after the final round. So Lidcombe set out to make this round 18 match against Greystanes a goal-a-thon, an aim they certainly achieved.

It was a relatively slow start by Lidcombe in the first half, in which three goals were scored, compared with nine in the second half. This produced a 12-0 win, their best result of the season and an impressive score, but it was not quite enough to secure second spot. Newington in their match vs Ermington won 8-0, so their goal difference after eighteen rounds is +53 (73F/20A) compared with Lidcombe's +50 (72F, 22A). Over eighteen rounds this is just about as close as you can get.

Lidcombe now faces Guildford McCredie in the semifinal, and the winner of this match will progress to the next semifinal the following week (to play the loser of the Newington vs Wentworthville semifinal). The Lidcombe U12 side is encouraged to keep up their open and energetic style of play as advised by their Coach, this has served them well in recent weeks.

In the finals series it is common for the team which best maintains their focus and discipline to ultimately prevail. The team certainly has the ability - best of luck to the U12's in their endeavours.

RESULTS OF MATCHES PLAYED SUNDAY 12TH AUGUST

AAL Div 4 drew 0-0 (won 3-2 on penalties) with Greystanes FC (White) at Glenwood Reserve

What a wow of a game! An epic, history-making battle. A fantastic, gripping spectacle. Two teams which really wanted to win and gave it everything. This is what you want to see in the finals. Both sides uncompromising in their efforts to prevail. So many great performances. Some examples - a courageous effort by Shai, playing in her earlier-than-planned comeback match after dislocating a knee earlier in the season. May, the human missile, running faster than a Pokemon and showing no fear in collision-battles for possession of the ball. Chi the gritty defender, methodically saving the day on a number of occasions when the situation looked desperate. The team's nuclear-powered core of Paige, Vanessa and Sam, calmly and continuously organising play. "No Flinch" Felicia the unstoppable force grinding the opposition down and pounding the ball forward when not copping a fusillade from them. Every Lidcombe player on the field did their part and did it superbly.

It took over two hours of nail-biting action to produce a result, which was literally decided by the last kick of the match. The first two halves of normal time produced relatively few good chances for shots at goal, such was the determination in the defence of both teams, but if any of those chances had produced a goal, it would have been game over. Extra time, the same. And so it came down to the penalty shootout scenario, with a minimum of five shots per team to be taken. With all players already having been out there for two hours, running themselves to a standstill, making a kick at goal from the penalty spot took on new degree of difficulty. Added to this was the drama, nerves and tension associated with the occasion, all taking part before a multitude of spectators.

The shootout commenced. In a flashback to the beginning of the season, the Lidcombe side gave the opposition a two goal head-start. It was hard to see Lidcombe making a comeback from that deficit. But, incredibly and astoundingly, come back they did. Lidcombe players held their nerve and Greystanes did not. Lidcombe put away their remaining three shots, whilst Greystanes missed theirs - one was saved by May in goals, and the other two hit the upright. With the final miss by Greystanes, Lidcombe had won 3-2 on penalties.

Whether it was from exhaustion or not believing what they had just witnessed, it took the Lidcombe AAL Div.4 coach running onto the pitch in celebration, for the Lidcombe side to realise that they had won this semfinal. Then an eruption of joy as the realisation took hold. A moment to savour.

For Greystanes, a tough way to be beaten in a semifinal, all credit to them for putting up such a fight and producing a memorable event.

Now, the Lidcombe team faces the other Greystanes team next week, with the winner of that match progressing to the grand final against The Ponds FC. As mentioned, every finals appearance by the Ladies team is history in the making for the Lidcombe club. Everyone is encouraged to come and support the team, it's also a great way to spend a Sunday morning.
