Special thanks also to the rest of the committee who started organising the season last December and have worked through to today's Presentation Day.



"We have found that by reaching for what appears to be the impossible, we often actually do the impossible; and even when we don't quite make it, we inevitably wind up doing much better than we would have done." This quote (from Jack Welch, one-time CEO of General Electric) applies to the 2018 All Age Ladies teams in a few ways.

To the players, congratulations on your success in 2018 and thank you for choosing to be part of the Lidcombe CSC club in 2018. We hope that you can continue your association in 2019.

Samantha CRAMER: One of a trio of players (along with Vanessa and Paige) who quietly and efficiently constructed the team's passages of play, in match after match. In addition to consistently providing order to the team's efforts, Sam scored four goals this year. She is one of the team's more experienced players and set the standard for application of soccer skills on the field and was a role model for the team in that respect. Sam brilliantly converted one of the penalties in the team's penalty shoot-out semi-final win over Greystanes (White).
