

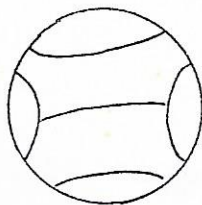

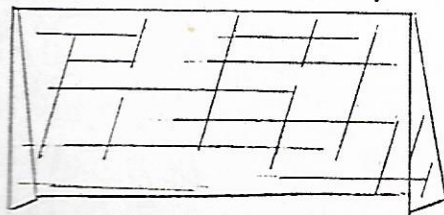

It is with great pleasure that the Lidcombe Congs Soccer Club is able to present to you its annual report for 1965 in this easy to read form.

Once again the club can look back on it's activities throughout the year with much pride and satisfaction.

Our success cannot be measured in winning teams but the sportsmanship shown and the fellowship enjoyed by all players left little to be desired.

During the season the club was confronted with a few difficult situations but we were able to come up with our heads held high.

The playing strength of our club for 1965 was 12 teams ranging as follows:- Under 8; 10; 12; 13A; 13B; 14; 16; 18A; 18B; 1st. 2nd. and 3rd. Grade sides. The number of players registered for the 12 teams was approximately 160, giving some indications as to the size our club has grown since our reforming in 1960.

A special word of thanks to the Committee of the Auburn Sports Soccer Club for their generous donations which have helped us on our way for the past two seasons. To the Lidcombe Bowling Club, thanks are extended to their members for their assistance. To our popular minister, the Rev John Richardson, the club has appreciated your interest that you have shown in our activities and attendance at a great number of our home games. The mammoth task of signing all those registration forms did not dampen your enthusiasm.



Others who have contributed to make our club strong are too numerous to mention by name but the club takes this opportunity to thank you with sincerity for your efforts.

With the tempo of the game of soccer increasing, the season saw the club with a few injuries but none of a real serious nature. Some form of insurance coverage will be in our thoughts for next season.

Two former members of our club met with serious accidents at the beginning of the season and the club is glad to see at last both Johnny Fathers and Colin Payne making good recoveries. Positions are available for both you boys to come back to us next year as managers or coaches to help our young brigade.

Last season the club thought fit to honour our lads who attained 100 games with the club. The clubs records are only available since our reforming in 1960, so we can only take our games from there. The first lad to achieve this honour was Greg Rosevear, a boy who has not missed a single game in 6 seasons. This season sees five other boys achieve this honour. Gordon Rosevear, Graham Teale, Graham Hillyard, Gary James and Peter James. The feat of playing 100 games for the one club is something to be very proud of particularly in this present age when the tempo has been set with the change of clubs that a number of our first division players make. Next season will, I hope bring more of our members into this 100 club. The clubs congratulations to you & boys.

The acquisition of Phillip Park this season has proved a boom and I would venture to say that the ground would rank with the best grounds in the P.C.S.F.A.

Next season we hope to make further improvements. The abnormal dry season did not allow us to proceed with our plans. The only teams to use Phillip Park for night training were the two under 13 teams, the under 14 team, the two under 18 teams and the 3 all age sides. I would say without fear of contradiction that our club enjoys one of the biggest followings for a junior club in the metropolitan area.
