



On the Canteen note one cannot let this item pass without heaping praise on the one and only "Mr Warmup Huteau". Norm's efforts in the carting the goods and the Canteen erection and dismantling Saturday after Saturday were of inestimable value.

The Eagleson family, Dave, Robert and Donn are to be complimented on their efforts in the Canteen erection each Saturday throughout the season. Each Saturday morning a little before 8 am the familar Holden Station Sedan would wend its way to Phillip Park. Thanks to the boys from Cross St.

Once again all teams in the Club shared in the use of Phillip Park and we have come to regard this ground as our own ground. Given one or two more seasons and the park will have a playing surface equal to the best in the association.

SIX-A-SIDE: This competition was held once again at Timbrell Park on the Queen's Birthday Week-end. Our Ladies once again ran a Canteen which proved a hugh success. The usual wet weather was encountered. All the Congs Teams tried hard and the only success we achieved was Jack Rider's team which won the 2nd. Grade competition.

LADIES TEAM: Our young ladies competed once more in the Ladies K.O. Comp. on the Monday of Queens Birthday Week-end and although eliminated in the first round played very soundly and enjoyed themselves. An earlier start next season will see these girls in the final. Thanks girls for representing the Club so well.

EQUIPMENT: The Club at present is well equipped, with all teams dressed in uniform shirts, good match balls, each team having a good set of corner flags, the nets pruchased last season standing up well. Generally speaking we are in a sound position in this regard.

PLAYERS: To the players of all teams, sincere thanks for your efforts throughout the year, your dress, behaviour, Club spirit and playing ability have been appreciated by your Club Committee. Hemember boys, always give your best and play the game. Hoping

to see you all again next season.
