
The team spirit still exists very strongly within the club, but I must admit that the lack of parental involvement is unfortunately very noticeable within our junior teams.

SECRETARY'S REPORT - 1981

The 1981 season was approached with a little concern as to the actual number of teams the club would be fielding. Even after the signing-on day at Phillips Park our numbers were down. Following under the various headings you will be able to follow the season's activities:


