

# SECRETARY'S REPORT

Once again another great season has come to an end and it is very pleasing to report that Lidcombe Uniting ("Congs") still commands a prominent place in our community.

Our club is certainly making its mark in the assimilation of peoples from many nations and new friendships are being quickly formed. This must ultimately benefit our country in the long term and we now boast players with backgrounds from sixteen different nations.

In 1982 twelve teams were fielded in the Protestant Churches Association being six junior teams and six All Age teams. The strength of any club is with its juniors so we must endeavour to at least maintain our present numbers.

On the field success came our way via the Under 14s who came from behind to defeat Auburn in the last match of the season. Both our Raahauge Cup 8th Division sides reached the finals but replays took their toll and both teams were defeated.

The Under 9s finished equal leaders with Yaralla and are destined for a play off to determine the winners.

#### MANAGERS:

The club is indebted to the folk who carried out these duties. Each year we are looking for people to fill these important positions and we welcome any new faces who may care to assist.

#### COACHES:

All teams were generally catered for in this department however there is an increasing need for an overall coaching plan to be instigated throughout the club.

#### CANTEEN:

As in previous years, the canteen was the central point of the club's activities. Sales of drinks, pies etc were at an all time high and I cannot praise the staff too highly.

#### GROUNDS:

In 1982 the club had the use of both grounds at Phillips Park but it is very evident that the playing surfaces are in need of urgent attention.

Again our thanks must go to the grand efforts of Auburn Council and it was pleasing to see that the canal adjacent to the main ground has now been filled in.

Discussions have been held with Council officials concerning an upgrading of the grounds and hopefully these discussions will bear fruition in 1983.

#### INJURIES:

The past season saw the club suffer its heaviest injury toll ever.

Three broken limbs saw Barry O'Keefe (Premier League), Garry Kerrigan (Premier League) and Jim Kottaridis (Raahauge Cup 9th Div) sidelined for most of the season.

However these injuries and others highlight the need for ALL players to adequately insure themselves and your Committee spent many meetings discussing the problem of non-insured players.

1982 also claimed a record for suspensions and this is one area where we are certainly not proud to boast.

While the club still attracted many new players this season, we were still light on parental support. To those parents who attended matches the club is very appreciative of your efforts and it is hoped that next year more parents will accompany their children to club matches.

With the introduction this year of six All Age teams, the highest our club has ever had, our loyal band of supporters were spread over several matches and grounds each Saturday. RON RIDER: Knows only one way to go and that is straight for the goals!


