

SECRETARY'S REPORT



Sport Injuries

Vincent Ardill, well known to Congo footballers for his treatment of sporting injuries, has kindly given some helpful advice to overcome some of the mis-conceptions that can cause serious problems.

He has treated many soccer

teams such as Auburn, Avala and Melita and he includes several Australian Socceroos on his books.

QUESTION: Hamstrings are a common soccer injury. What can we do for treatment?

ANSWER: This is only my opinion but I believe hamstring injuries are directly related to a "rotated" hip. This means that the hip is not sitting properly in its socket but it is a simple matter of adjustment by a qualified person to place the hip in its correct position.

An out-of-position hip will put a great strain on the

hamstring so always go for an examination.

QUESTION: When I feel an ankle or knee give way what should I do? ANSWER: If you wish to play again in the not-too-distant future $\frac{1}{2}$

you should come off the field immediately.

Treatment in the first instance is the same for all muscle injuries and that is to apply ice packs to the affected area. Continue the ice three times a day for 20 minutes each day for 72 hours then alternate with heat such as a ray lamp, Deep Heat or similar.

Of course the sooner you attend a clinic the sooner

will you be back on the field.

QUESTION: What advantage is there in having a massage?

ANSWER: A massage will relieve aching muscles and often other serious injuries can be treated on the spot. One club I treat has no-one from the Third Grade in for a massage, several in from the Reserves and ALL the First Grade! Might be something to do with age!

QUESTION: What are your views on the use of medicated sprays such as "Skefron"?

ANSWER: As a pain relief spray for muscle injuries I believe "Skefron" is excellent but definitely NOT for injuries to

Geoff Morgan, a previous club Recording Officer, was of great assistance in 1985 and John Hawach contributed some vital information.







