

SECRETARY'S REPORT

In its inaugural year the Lidcombe Churches Soccer Club has enjoyed a most successful season.

The amalgamation between the St.

Joachims Parish and the Lidcombe Uniting
Church Soccer Clubs proceeded much more
smoothly than had been earlier anticipated
and 1986 saw three of the junior sides -

the Under 7s, 10s and 13s- take out their respective competitions.

However the greatest measure of the season's success was the Club's ability to attract thirty five children who had never played soccer before.

We were also fortunate to field full strength Under 7 and Under 8 sides which is something the two former clubs had been unable to achieve prior to amalgamation.

Our successes on and off the field in 1986 signify a bright future for Lidcombe Churches but we must beware of complacency.

A summary of the Club's activities during the season is set out below:-

TEAMS:

Eleven teams were fielded this season - seven junior sides ranging from Under 7s to Under 15s (total playing strength of 100) and four senior sides (55 players).

The growth of numbers in the very junior ranks is especially significant and is the most pleasing aspect of the amalgamation.

Congratulations go to those players and officials who were successful in their competitions however equally satisfying was the performances of all our junior sides.

Of the senior sides in 1986 both the First and Second Grade teams had disappointing seasons after promising so much in the earlier rounds.

A combination of both injuries to key personnel and the

unreliability of others saw the two sides' performances slip dramatically in the latter part of the season.

Obviously the Club's Management Committee will take a long and hard look at these players who let us down in 1986 especially when it comes to registration time next season.

More pleasing was the efforts of the 3rd and 4th grade sides who both made the semi finals.

The 3rds, a team comprised of many long serving Club players (ten aged over 35!) finished in fourth position after being defeated in the minor semi final.

The 4ths finished as Minor Premiers but were defeated unluckily in the final.

COACHES AND MANAGERS:-

Signing-on day in February attracted more juniors than anticipated and fortunately we were eventually able to fill all coaching and managerial positions.

Special mention must be made of four Under 15 players-James May, Eddie Mendez, Levent Pinar and Scott Rayner who coached and managed the Under 8s and Under 10s.

On occasions they were prepared to miss their own game when playing times clashed rather than leave the young ones without supervision.

Scott and Mick Anlezark, who coached the Under 15s, attended a Level One coaching course organised by the Association in May and the feedback from them was quite favourable.

The course is not difficult and is designed for $\underline{\text{anyone}}$ looking after junior teams.

CANTEEN: -

It was pleasing to see the canteen fully operational this year and acting as the focal point of our Club's activities.

Special mention must be made of Betty Lancaster and Jeanette Raffaele who took prime responsibility for the running of the canteen.

Betty willingly continued in this role even though her

son had to withdraw from the Under 11s after only a few games as he was required to play for his school side on Saturdays.

Many thanks also must go to Carol and Chuck L'Heureux who worked quietly in the background purchasing and restocking the canteen.

SPONSORSHIP:-

The Club is indebted to Lidcombe Travel Service for their monetary support this season and any Club member intending to travel should certainly consult this firm concerning any arrangements needed.

At the time of writing I report that our approach to the Lidcombe Catholic Workmen's Club for monetary support has not been successful to date but we understand that this matter is still being considered by the club.

EQUIPMENT:-

1986 saw each team supplied with training balls as well as a new quality match ball.

In addition each player received a pair of Club socks on registration.

Unfortunately due to the Club's inability to attract a major sponsor we were unable to achieve our goal of outfitting each team in a strip of the new Club colours.

However the team strips that we inherited from the former clubs were, with rare exceptions, in good condition.

All teams were well presented and new shirts were obtained for the Under 14s and 15s but only for the last few matches due to late shipment.

SUPPORTERS:-

Most of the junior sides were very well supported and it was heartening to hear the constant sideline encouragement from parents and friends.

This encouragement can only help the players to enjoy their soccer which is important if we are to avoid the "dropping out" of footballers which is happening in the various codes.

All members of our Club are well aware of the excellent soccer reports which appeared this year in the Review Pictorial newspaper.

You may not be aware that these reports were written by Neil Rudgley and involved him in a considerable amount of time and effort each week.

The Lidcombe Churches Soccer Club is indebted to Neil for his excellent publicity and many thanks must also go to Mr. Charles Elias and his staff at the Torch Publishing Co. for allowing our reports to be published in the local paper.

As you read through this year's Annual Report I am sure you will have appreciated the high quality of the publication and again Neil Rudgley, as he has done so for many years, has been the driving force behind this excellent magazine.

I am pleased to report that Neil, in addition to being awarded the Best Clubman Trophy for the third time, will be honoured at today's presentation with a Life Membership badge.

INDIVIDUAL PERFORMANCES:-

Congratulations go to Bill Knowles (R/C3) on reaching the 200 game mark on 21/6/86 following an illustrious career which started back in 1967.

100 game awards have gone to Keiran O'Hara (U/13), Gabreal Halvagi (U/14), Perry Panousopoulos (U/15), Chris Woo (U/15), Peter Hamilton (R/C2) and Glenn Hamilton (R/C1).

FREDERICK LEE: Frederick left us mid-season but he showed that he had the makings of a fair footballer.


