# SECRETARY'S REPORT

The Lidcombe Churches Soccer Club was formed in 1985 when St Joachims Parish Soccer Club and Lidcombe Uniting Church Soccer Club amalgamated, and was again run this year by senior players most of whom started with Lidcombe Uniting as juniors and grew up with the Club.

Life would be much easier for these players if they did not have to worry about the juniors and just had to turn up for their own game each Saturday afternoon.

However these senior players have made a conscious decision to put something back into the game and to give local juniors the same opportunity as they were given many years ago to play organised sport each Saturday morning with their friends at a ground close to their homes.

On behalf of the junior players and their parents I therefore thank these senior players for their valuable contributions to the club.

A summary of the Club's activities during the 1991 season is set out as follows:-

#### JUNIORS:

Despite only fielding five teams this year (one less than in 1990) the number of junior players actually increased from 62 to 67 with the most pleasing features being the fielding of a very strong Under Six team and the last minute formation of an Under 14 side.

I should also mention that the Under Six team included one very keen young girl - well done Belinda Larkin!

Our only competition successes came from the Under 12 side (undefeated premiers and six-a-side winners) but from what I could see all other teams tried their hardest and were a credit to the Club.

#### **SENIORS:**

Our First and Second Grade teams both made it to their respective Grand Finals but unfortunately met better teams on the day and had to be content with the runner-up positions while the All Age C Grade six-a-side was won by a composite team from the 1990 and 1991 All Age.

The All Age side's form fluctuated during the season - losing 13-0 one week and then defeating the second-placed team two weeks later - but the most significant feature of their season was the continued improvement shown by some of the younger players and they are now ready to advance to the top grades next season.

# COACHES AND MANAGERS:

My thanks go to those dedicated people who undertook these positions with special mention being made of Alex Morozoff and James May who looked after two sides and were responsible for organising the Under 14 team at the last minute.

SECRETARY'S REPORT (continued):

Unfortunately it would appear that some of our Coaches and Managers may not be backing up next season and I am therefore very keen to hear from anyone interested in volunteering their services next year.

#### BEST CLUBMAN:

The choice of James May and Alex Morozoff as joint recipients of the Best Clubman award was a foregone conclusion.

Not only did they look after two sides (the Under 6s and Under 14s) but they also went to the markets most Saturdays to purchase oranges and then returned to Phillips Park to assist with putting up the nets.

If that wasn't enough, they also looked after the canteen wherever possible!

Thanks for all your efforts!

#### CANTEEN:

Due to the sharing of Phillips Park with Berala Uniting club this year and some excellent programming by the Association, the canteen operated on most Saturdays and we were able to record a profit of almost \$1,000.

This excellent result should ensure that even after paying for today's picnic and presentation day the club should have sufficient funds to purchase new strips for ALL junior sides next season.

In addition to James and Alex mentioned above, I would also like to thank the small band of helpers who answered my call for assistance at various times throughout the year namely Mesdames Firmstone, Haddad, James, Larkin, Norris, Ryan, Rudgley together with April Pilling and Nadalie Rudgley.

### INDIVIDUAL PERFORMANCES:

Two players- Mick Anlezark and Stephen James - netted their 100th club goal this season. This is quite an achievement when you consider that only 24 players have been able to reach this milestone in the Club's 52 year history and my congratulations go to both of them.

Other noteworthy performances were recorded by Peter "Spindle" Hamilton and Ken Cambaz who both played their 200th game this season. Peter reckons he is going into retirement but I've got a feeling that he will be back next year!

Congratulations also to Glenn Spierings, Peter Barry, Trevor Hofer, Kurt Edwards and Vincent Gerada who all reached their 100th game during 1991.

#### CONCLUSION:

Over the years the Club has, I believe, been very good to its juniors. Our emphasis has been as much on having fun as learning to play soccer.

Wherever possible we let the juniors play with their friends, we

# UNDER EIGHT TEAM REPORT











