SECRETARY'S REPORT

With the benefit of the driest winter for a number of years, the Club had an enjoyable and reasonably successful season with probably the most pleasing feature being the increased family involvement with 21 sets of brothers playing and five families having fathers and sons playing.

A major disappointment of the season was the poor behaviour of some of our older junior players and a few senior players and this is discussed in more detail later in this report.

A brief summary of the Club's activities in 1992 is set out below:-

JUNIORS:

With the last-minute formation of an under 15 side, we were able to field one more team than last year (six teams with 70 players compared to 67 players in 1991). However, as the season progressed I came to regret going to the trouble of organising a game for the under 15s. A few showed no gratitude whatsoever for what was done for them.

Potentially the 15s were a very good side and, in fact, they won two competitions this year but it was a constant battle to transport them to away games because, with one or two notable exceptions, parental support was non-existent. Also, despite assurances they gave me at the start of the season, a small number of the boys just could not control themselves with their behaviour, particularly in the last game, being absolutely appalling.

These boys must learn that there is such a thing as loyalty to their Club and team-mates. I will not labour the point any further but any player who does not receive a trophy today can rest assured that he is not welcome at this Club while I have anything to do with it.

I should not let the actions of these irresponsible few detract from the performances of the remainder of our juniors who all tried their hardest and played the game in the right spirit. They are a credit to the Club.

Competition successes again came the way of the under 12 side who became the first team in the Club's history to win all three competitions (the premiership, knock-out and six-a-side) but we have come to expect this from this fine side who are a perfect example of how far you can go with a positive attitude and a fighting team spirit.

As regards the other juniors, our under 6s and under 7s turned in many fine displays during the season and we appear to have a number of future stars scattered amongst those sides. You could not have met a happier person than James May after his under 7s defeated arch-rivals Georges Hall in the last game of the season!

The under 9s tried their hardest but struggled all season with lack of size being one of their biggest problems. Why can't we grow them bigger in Lidcombe? There are some good players in

this team and all I can say to the boys is to hang in there for if you keep on putting in the effort then your turn will come.

Further improvement was shown by the under 11s and they were able to record a number of strong wins. Unfortunately they are still a bit inconsistent and must learn to put in that extra effort when playing the top sides.

SENIORS:

As mentioned above, a small number of the senior players lacked self control and let the Club down with their behaviour with most of the problems stemming from an unwillingness to accept the referee's decision.

The deeds of these few have impacted on the Club's good name and it is a situation which the Management Committee will not tolerate. Next year we will be looking closely at who we are prepared to register and even if it means cutting down to one or two teams we are determined that the Club's reputation will be protected.

In addition, any player sent off can expect to be dealt with by the Club's Management Committee as well as by the Association's Judiciary Committee.

Another disappointment of the season was the number of players who felt they could pick and choose when they wanted to play, often not even having the courtesy to let us know when they would not be playing. On one occasion, our first and second grade squad was only able to field thirteen players for two games. Attendance at training also left a lot to be desired.

Players must really start showing more loyalty to the Club.

On the field, the seniors recorded some mixed performances with the best being the equal fourth position achieved by the second grade (missing out on a semi-final spot on goal averages) and the 3rd grade's battling effort to make the final of the B grade knock-out.

COACHES AND MANAGERS:

Fortunately the Club was again well served by dedicated people who undertook to carry out these duties and on behalf of the boys and their parents I thank them for their efforts.

Special mention must be made of the "oldies", Jack Dutton and Les Wilson, who ensured that the under 6s enjoyed themselves; also Joel and Tony Harvey who tried hard with the under 9s side that played in a fairly tough competition; and also Tony Tannous and Kieran O'Hara who worked hard with the under 11s and were rewarded with some good results.

Planning for next season has already commenced and anyone interested in helping out is invited to contact me as soon as possible. The manager's job, in particular, is not too demanding!

SECRETARY'S REPORT (continued):

BEST CLUBMAN:

Last year's Best Clubmen, James May and Alex Morozoff, put in similar efforts for the Club this year and could have quite easily received the award again.

However, this year the Committee felt that the efforts of Geoff Rider in training and helping to manage the first and second grade teams should not go unrewarded and he therefore joins his parents as a worthy recipient of this award. I might add that Geoff has been playing with us since he was five years old and is rapidly approaching 500 games so there is no disputing that he has not been a great contributor to the Club over the years. Congratulations, "Jacko"!

INDIVIDUAL PERFORMANCES:

After taking into account the number of games that veteran Jimmy Pincott played in the 1940's, the Committee has recognised that Jimmy played his 500th game this season. Much has been written about him over the years and there is little more that I can add except to say that he is a marvellous competitor and an inspiration to us all. Well done, Jimmy, and I hope to see you back with us next year to continue chasing Ray "Curly" James' 600 games record!

Another stalwart of the Club over the years, Sam Dib, has become only the 24th player to reach the 300 games milestone and my congratulations go to him. It certainly is a long time since Sammy played in 1965 with his WOODEN STUDS!!

Other notable performances were recorded by Kieran O'Hara, who reached his 200th game and seems to have cemented a position in first grade, and also Joe Loulach and Ross Mendicino who both played their 100th game in 1992.

FINANCES:

After paying for today's picnic and presentation day I estimate that we will not have much more than \$100 in the bank but I regard our finances as satisfactory as we incurred substantial non-recurring expenditure this year, mainly the purchase of four new strips and also a line marker (which will substantially reduce our ground marking expenses in the future). Next year new strips will be purchased for the under 6s to under 8s.

Of course, the main reason why we are able to hold today's presentation day, which will cost in the vicinity of \$1,000, is the canteen which recorded a profit of about \$900 this year. My thanks go to the many people who helped out this year but I will not attempt to name them all for fear of missing someone! However, I must acknowledge the efforts of James May and Alex Morozoff, and especially Sandra James, who always answered my call for help when I ran out of volunteers.

To date, the Club has been able to survive without sponsorship and we can continue to do so but naturally I would be interested to hear from anyone who might consider being a sponsor or knows of a sponsorship opportunity because there is more we could do for the players, particularly the juniors, if extra funds were available.

UNDER 6 TEAM REPORT

Lidcombe opened the season with eight players, three of whom - Jimmy Moussa, Rammy Darsa and Glen Wilson - backed up from last year's Under 6 side and these experienced footballers formed the nucleus of the 1992 team.

Other team members were Rabeeh Ibrahim, Andrew Kovelis, Anthony Rancan, Jay Taha and Joel Zammit while a late starter was Daniel James.

After winning the two trial games, the team suffered a surprising defeat in the opening competition game against O.L.Q.P. when a draw would have been a fairer result. The first goal came when our 'keeper saved a shot but stepped back over the line and the winning goal occurred with the ball just rolling into the net.

Our other loss (also against O.L.Q.P.) happened at that club's home ground when Lidcombe fielded the bare six players. Jimmy Moussa had run himself to a standstill by halftime so I was forced to spell him in goals for the remainder of the game.

We gained some revenge for these two losses when we defeated O.L.Q.P. twice throughout the season and the team scored 85 goals and allowed only 14 goals in the 17 games actually played.

By midseason we had lost Jay Taha (for some unknown reason) and Anthony Rancan who missed six games through illness just when both boys were starting to show improvement in their game.

With Rabeeh Ibrahim also absent for three games it gave us an opportunity to introduce Daniel James who played very well for such a youngster and with a bit more speed he will become a big asset for next season.

Undoubtedly Jimmy Moussa was the side's best player closely followed by Rammy Darsa with both players scoring most of the team's goals and these boys will feature prominently in future seasons for the club.

Andrew Kovelis was the choice for the Most Improved Player and this was never more evident than in his last game against Berala when he was loaned to Berala and he certainly starred against his own team!

. Joel Zammit and Glen Wilson played consistently throughout the























YA GOTTA LAUGH!!
