

GREAT MOMENTS IN HISTORY!

PS: George stayed on the field and Lidcombe won 1-0 (so there!).

SECRETARY'S REPORT

Summarised below are details of the club's activities during 1993.

JUNIORS

Despite the decision to disband last year's Under 15 side because of problems encountered with the players, the club was still able to enter the same number of teams as 1992 (six teams, 74 players) with probably the most encouraging feature being the large number of new players in the Under 6s and Under 7s which augurs well for the future.

Our ability to attract new players each year is due primarily to the support that we receive from the local schools at the start of the season particularly St. Joachims Parish School. Our strong links with that school were maintained during the year when Sam Darsa and myself coached two teams representing St. Joachims at a combined Catholic Schools' Gala Day in May.

On the field, five of our six teams recorded creditable performances with:

- * the Under 6s, despite seven new players, playing strongly and making it to the final of the six-a-side;
- * the Under 7s, a team formed at the very last minute, surprising everyone with their competitive play throughout the season;
- * the Under 8s, in their first season on the big field and with half the team still eligible for the Under 7s, finishing fourth in the competition;
- * the Under 10s, improving dramatically on their last placing in 1992, finishing runner-up to the very strong O.L.O.R. side against whom they played three very closely contested games;
- * the Under 13s winning all three competitions (the premiership, Knock-out and Six-a-side), a feat which they also achieved in 1992 when they became only the first team in the club's history to take out the treble.

Our other junior team, the Under 12s, after a bright start to the season when they won their first two games, proved to be a disappointment although they did reach the six-a-side semifinals. Injuries did not help their cause but at times some of the boys lacked team spirit which detracted from the side's performances. The players concerned really must learn that soccer is all about playing as a team, providing support and encouragement to your mates rather than criticising them.

SENIORS

It is pleasing to report that the behaviour and attitude of our senior sides improved significantly from last year with the

decision to reduce to only two senior sides no doubt having some effect in this regard.

Our first grade side, appreciating the drop from first division down to second division, performed consistently throughout the season and were probably unlucky to lose 1-0 to Rozelle in the final when they appeared to be the better team on the day.

The second grade side, which included many players from our 1992 fourth grade team, found the going tough against the top three teams but with a bit more consistency in their play they could have at least made the semis.

COACHES AND MANAGERS

This was probably one of the easiest seasons I have experienced as regards filling the coaching and managerial positions.

Jack Dutton continued his excellent efforts with the Under 6s, Les Wilson and Joe Zammit answered my call when we made a last minute decision to enter an Under 7 team and the older boys certainly benefited from the efforts and experience of some of the senior players - James May (U/8s), Ken Cambaz (U/10s), Tony Tannous and Christian Marinas (U/12s).

My thanks to these people and also to anyone else who assisted with the running of teams.

SIX-A-SIDE

For the first time in many years, the club was represented by all teams at this gala event held over the June long weekend with meritorious performances being recorded by the U/13s - winners for the third successive year; the U/6s who made it to the final which was not played until late in the afternoon when the boys must have been half frozen; and the U/8s and U/12s who lost narrowly in the quarterfinals after playing four games.

An unfortunate feature of play on the Saturday was that very few games went ahead at the scheduled time with the delays being especially frustrating because of the bitterly cold weather. While I am sure the boys all still enjoyed themselves, some of the parents and supporters were NOT too impressed.

The club has already made strong representations for the organisation of this event to be improved in the future and hopefully people will give the Soccer Association another chance and support the event in 1994.

BEST CLUBMAN

While a pleasing feature of the season was the number of people who were prepared to step in and volunteer their services from time to time, the Committee really could not go past James May as the recipient of the Best Clubman Award.

James has received this award on two previous occasions and who could deny his credentials this year! As well as reaching his 300th game for the club this year, he also coached the U/8s, helped with groundmarking, organised the oranges each Saturday,

filled in as referee when required and kept an eye on the canteen where there was nobody else around I could call on.

Bill Archer also deserves a special mention for making and attaching hooks to the goalposts at Phillips Park which has made putting up the nets so much easier.

INDIVIDUAL PERFORMANCES

What a year it was for the veterans of the club with Geoff Rider becoming only the sixth person to play 500 club games; Trevor "Lumpy" Lavender playing his 400th game (only ten others have achieved this feat) and James May reaching his 300th game!

Geoff's very proud parents, both already life members of the club, were on hand at Phillips Park on 17 July to see him play his 500th game and to receive his Life Membership badge which is awarded automatically when this milestone is reached. Unfortunately Geoff's father passed away only a few weeks later but I know that his day at Phillips Park gave him a lot of pleasure.

Other notable performances were recorded by Nigel Batts and John Hawach who both played their 200th club game during the season and by Scott Ashbrooke, Erhan Erdogan, Shaadi Haddad, Chris Hastings, Ante Kinda, Christian Marinas and John Tannous who all reached 100 games.

Also Alex Morozoff and Mathew James joined the elite group of just 26 players who have scored 100 goals for the club with Mathew now equalling his brother's feat.

Congratulations to all the abovementioned players for their achievements.

FINANCES

Today's picnic and presentation day will cost the club about \$1,200 which should leave us with approximately \$400 in the bank with which to commence next season - a satisfactory situation considering that we now have relatively new strips for almost all teams and a good supply of match and training balls.

While the canteen is the main reason for the reasonable state of our finances, I am also pleased to report that this year the club benefited to the extent of \$350 sponsorship from the Lidcombe R S & L Community Club to assist in the purchase of a strip of shirts for which we are greatly appreciative.

As regards the canteen, my thanks to the many people who helped out during the year who are too numerous to mention by name but I would be remiss if I did not acknowledge the support I received from my wife, Sandra who was always willing to step in and help out whenever the canteen was undermanned.

Of course, another reason why our finances are in a satisfactory state is that with the purchase of a ground marker in 1992 our marking expenses are now minimal and my thanks to James May for

assisting me in marking the grounds this year.

ANNUAL REPORT AND PUBLICITY

My thanks to Neil "Rock" Rudgley who has again produced a superb report for all to enjoy and his "The Lighter Side of Six-a-side" and cartoons have certainly topped off a marvellous publication.

The recording of the club statistics is the envy of all other clubs and I know that they provide a most comprehensive record for all our players. Again "Rock" has maintained this vital aspect of the club's history.

Thanks also go to Charles Elias and Wayne Cousins from the Torch Publishing who produce the Auburn Review Pictorial newspaper and made the space available for our weekly reports.

BILL HENDERSON

The club lost a long-time supporter in Bill Henderson who passed away earlier this year following a long illness.

Bill was a former Vice-President of our club and his three sons and daughter all played soccer at various times for Lidcombe.

Our condolences go to the Henderson family.

CONCLUSION

For a variety of reasons - good weather, the large inflow of new junior players into the club, the willingness of people to help, well behaved teams, strong performances by most of our teams and the reasonable state of our finances - this has been one of the most enjoyable seasons I had had in my eight years as Secretary.

Soccer club members, and the Lidcombe community as a whole, were saddened by the passing of club Life Member Jack Rider on August 4 this year.


Jack suffered a stroke in 1989 shortly after attending the club's 50th Anniversary Dinner and he was severely incapacitated since that time.

TARAK ZEIN: Terry developed his tackling and understanding of the game this year and enjoyed an overall improved season. However, training wasn't one of his favourite hobbies and he will improve even more if he is more attentive. A real trier.

THE EARLY DAYS!



The Lidcombe Congregational Soccer Club was formed in 1939 ("Pop") and Hazel James and all-age side represented Lidcombe that season in the Protestant Churches Football competition.

The "Congregational" part of the name was shortened to "Congs" or "Congos" from the very first match played.

The age of the players ranged

AUTHOR "CURLY" JAMES 14 years to mid 30s although most had never played the game before and the club's home ground was at Wyatt Park (Phillips Park was only an open paddock used as a tip in those days).

The club's first game was played at Wyatt Park - later described in a book titled "Growing Up in Liddy" as "denuded of grass" and the result was a surprising 1-1 draw with Carlingford.

Arch-rivals of the day turned out to be a team representing Lidcombe-Berala Presbyterian Church who were called the "Bloodshirts" because of their red strip.

The two matches against the local foes resulted in 12-0 and 13-0 wins to the opposition - hardly notable events!!

Lidcombe finished near the tail of the field in 1939 and it took until 1943 for the club to bring home its first trophy which was the Under 14 premiership.

A number of the side saw active service during World War 2 and because of this team was rarely the same each week. international Lidcombe Oval was chosen as the venue for an services athletics meet and various nationalities represented at the carnival. Top event of the day was a 100 yard sprint (first prize was \$20!) and the big money was on the Yanks. Those Aussies in the know bet on a sprightly local named Ray James and the Lidcombe Congs footballer didn't let down his army mates as he swept away to take the event!!

The winnings represented a small fortune in those days as the army pay was 60 cents a day!

During the 1940s several junior sides commenced with present player Jimmy Pincott being a member of the premiership-winning under 14 team in 1947.

The war years saw soccer balls at a premium and Jimmy recalls several games when a bundle of rags was used as the ball! fact, clothing was also in short supply and most players wore home-made shirts and shorts with a large belt holding up the frequently over-sized shorts!

THE EARLY DAYS! (continued):

If you had boots you were one of the lucky few and the style of the day was ankle boots with leather studs NAILED to the soles of the boot. They were of exceptionally good quality in those days and a pair of boots would be expected to last for many seasons!

Jimmy Pincott also remembers the day that his father took exception to young Jim playing in a higher grade and Pincott senior strode onto the field during the match and dragged Jimmy off the ground and all the way home!

During the late 40s and early 50s, the club was controlled by two local identities in Bob Dobie and Bobby Crawford.

A short recess during the 50s saw our Congs players link up with teams from St Stephens Church of England and Lidcombe Methodists however as the sixties approached these two clubs also struggled for players and Lidcombe Congreagational reformed with an under 8 side in 1960.

Success came the following year when an Under 12 side captained by Terry Hore took out the competition and a steady stream of trophies has since come the club's way over the years!
