







SECRETARY'S REPORT

The club's activities for the past season are summarised as follows:

JUNIORS:

This season we were only able to field three junior teams being the Under 8s, Under 10s and the Under 16s comprising 55 registered players.

The lack of junior players in our club is due to the fact that we were unable to find the personnel who could spare a few hours a week teaching the younger sides. This is a rewarding and worthwhile activity that I can highly recommend. To anyone interested in coaching a side in the future I would urge you not to hesitate to contact myself or any member of the Management Committee as the growth and development of our junior sides is paramount to the club's survival.

Congratulations must go to Jack Dutton's Under 8's who won the premiership after a play-off with Wentworthville Uniting. This was a most exciting game which saw Lidcombe prove that they were the best performed team all season and thoroughly deserved the competition honours. For their efforts this season the Under 8's have been awarded the Robert Brown Memorial Shield for Meritorious Team - well done to Jack and his team!

The other competition win for the club came from Ken James' Under 16's, the most successful team in our club over the past ten years (and probably ever!). This year they won the knockout competition and finished second to Blacktown Reform Church by only two points in the premiership. The difference of the two points certainly coming from the first-game loss against Blacktown at Phillips Park.

Special mention must be made of the Under 10s whose previous best finish was fifth and this season they came second by two points to Yaralla Blue, made the quarter final of the Knockout and also the semifinal of the Six-a-side.

SENIORS:

The seniors fielded a Raahauge Cup squad of two teams in Division 2 - up two divisions from 1994. The firsts had a disappointing season after winning the competition last year and promising so much early in the season. Some good results in the final three rounds gave us some restored confidence for next season. The seconds had a good start to the season, losing only one of the first four games only to come up against Telopea and St Matthews where the wheels fell off! The younger players will improve with the experience gained this year and the seconds should be a stronger, more formidable force in 1996.

EQUIPMENT:

The playing strips which have been in use for the past three years are in excellent shape and should last for another season at least. New training balls were purchased at the commencement of the season and used extensively throughout the club.

COACHES AND MANAGERS: My thanks go to Jack Dutton (U/8's) and Ken James (U/16's) who looked after their respective teams. Special mention to Jack who, for the first year, was coaching a side on a full-size field - a far cry from the Under 6's and Under 7's on the smaller fields. Alan Pilling and Geoff Rider again controlled the Raahauge Cup squad in their usual efficient manner.

CANTEEN:

The canteen was once again the focal point of the club's activities. This is where the overwhelming source of our revenue is gained and, although profits were down on previous seasons, we were still able to keep the club in the black.

Special mention must be made of Narelle Foggon and Ken James who kept the canteen stocked and running like clockwork throughout the season.

SPONSORSHIP:

The club is indebted to the Lidcombe RSL and Community Club for its monetary support this season - a club which supports many organisations throughout the local community. I certainly hope that this support continues in the future and club members are urged to return the favour by utilising the facilities at the club in Wellington Park.

SUPPORTERS:

All of our junior sides were very well supported and it was encouraging to hear the constant cheers and support of family and friends on the sidelines. This encouragement can only help the players to enjoy their football.

Can I add a special note of thanks to the Haddads who have been two of Lidcombe's keenest ever supporters over the years!

The seniors enjoyed their usual support from wives, girlfriends and friends. It was good to see these supporters not only encouraging the players but also supporting the club through the use of the canteen and the raffles which proved very popular this year.

SYMPATHIES EXTENDED:

The passing of last season's Under 6 Coach Joe Zammit only a matter of weeks after the 1994 presentation day was a shock to us all and the tragedy that saw the life of former player Peter Savage cut so short in August also brought sadness to the club.

We extend our sympathies to both families.

ANNUAL REPORT AND PUBLICITY:

As you read through this Annual Report I am sure you will appreciate the quality of the publication and, once again, Neil Rudgley, as he has done for many years, has been the driving force behind this excellent magazine. Special mention must also go to Steven Rudgley (for his cover design) and Brett and Steven May who copied and collated the final publication you are now reading.

I am sure that all members of the club are aware of the weekly soccer reports which appear in the Review Pictorial newspaper. These reports are written by Neil Rudgley who puts a considerable amount of time each week in doing so and apart from our thanks to him we also thank Wayne Cousins from the Review for allocating the space free of charge.

BEST CLUBMAN: I am pleased to report that the committee has recognised the efforts of Scott Ashbrooke this year by awarding him the Norm Huteau Memorial Trophy for Best Clubman. UNDER 8 TEAM REPORT

I am proud to report that 1995 was a very satisfying season with the side coming away with a victory in the play-off game for the premiership against Wentworthville.

There have been some entertaining and exciting matches played throughout the season but none so much as the game against Yaralla Gold. Lidcombe could only field nine players with several of the best players absent with the flu but those nine boys played their hearts out before winning 1-0. I am pleased to say that my finger nails have now regrown!

For the majority of the season Lidcombe sat on top of the table until a loss against All Saints Blue followed by a draw with Yaralla Gold put us two points behind our last-match opponents Wentworthville. We had to win the match to force a play-off and the boys did not let me down with a thrilling 1-0 win up at Freame Park.

The play-off game at Tait Reserve was a game that our side never looked like losing and although the scoreline finished at 3-2 I believe that we were a three goal better side that day!

To all the team I say "well done" and you deserve your premiership.

A note of thanks to Bob Thiel for his assistance during training and, of course, to my wife Kath for her washing of the shirts each week.

My choice for the Most Consistent Player without doubt goes to Iain Maunder. His running and goalscoring gave us a big advantage against all sides.

For the Most Improved (what a difficult job!) I have selected Alexander Smith just ahead of Vitor De Nito, Robert Volpato and Thomas Northey. Alexander put some clever combinations into his play this year and was a deserved recipient of the award.

The team was:

<u>VITOR DE NETO:</u> Don't let this boy's size fool you. He may be small but knows no fear when making a challenge for the ball. A clever player who gives 100% in all his games. Played at fullback for the majority of the season and excelled against Wenty in the last competition game. Very reliable.

<u>DANIEL FERGUSON:</u> Another player used in the backs this season who played mostly in the centre of the defence. He holds his position very well and can show a fair turn of speed turning in continual strong games.

ANTHONY GHALEB: His first season in soccer and naturally he found the going a bit tough but he tried hard when given the opportunity. It took us until late in the season to realise that Anthony may have the makings of a second goalkeeper and his chance will come next season.

SAHIN KAZAN: Another player who is small in the defence but very speedy. In a number of matches he was the maintstay of the backs. He has the ability to break up an attack and move the ball back down the field. He is also a promising forward and (wait for it!) should be the Number 2 goalkeeper but he dislikes this position!

ANDREW ILIEFF: Andrew is the first choice goalkeeper and does a first rate job. His penalty save against Wenty in the last competition game gave us the opportunity of forcing the replay (the way he was thrust into the goals he would never have spoken to anyone had he missed the save!). Plays well in the forwards and, coincidentally, scored the only goal of the match against Wenty that day.

<u>DANIEL JAMES:</u> Daniel is a very good player and mostly played on the right wing. He reads a game very well and if his side is under pressure he will often drop back into defence. A very strong kicker in any position he likes to do his own thing now and again (why worry!) but he needs to understand that he cannot beat the opposition all on his own!

<u>DANNY LAHOUD:</u> First season in the game for Danny but unfortunately missed training far too often. He will be better for the run next season.

IAIN MAUNDER: Iain is very fast and a natural left footer. He has the ability to make a break, beat two or three defenders and put in a terrific shot for goal. With some better control of the ball he will be an even better player but certainly in 1995 he was the mainstay of the team playing out on the left wing and setting up many attacks for goals.

SHANE MELKI: Eligible for under 7s Shane turned in some very good games this year. Unfortunately, like Danny, he missed some training and turned up late for several games but if he can become more reliable then his football skills will improve.

BEN MILLER: Ben has a big kick and with a little more experience he will make a very good fullback. This season he played several matches in goals but he prefers playing out on the field where, with some improvement in speed, he will find his position even better.

THOMAS NORTHEY: This little fellow is a real goer on the field and he is not afraid to take on players bigger than himself! With a little more power in his kicking Thomas will be a great asset in the future. He played mostly in the middle of the defence this season. On occasions I would call out to him to take a spell but I am sure that he didn't want to hear me such was his liking to stay on the field!

KEVIN O'HALLORAN: The first time that I met Kevin was at our initial training session and not knowing many of the boys' names I asked him what his was. The answer was that it was "Kevin, but they call me the'pocket rocket'"! There isn't much of him

but he certainly lives up to his nickname. He runs well with the ball and positions himself to take the pass which means well for his football future.

ALEX SMITH: Alex is a coach's dream as he listens to everything that is said to him, nods his head in approval (as if to say 'O.K.') and, with no backchat, out he goes and gets on with the job. This season he has improved a lot and can use his feet when going for the ball. Plays in centre midfield and towards the latter part of the season he showed some clever touches with his head.

KAREEM SOUROUR: Kareem will always train hard enjoying himself at training but it is on match days that he loses a bit of confidence against other players. 
