Predominately having returning players also made training a lot more fun than previous years, with the players able to spend more time learning positions rather than solely focusing on basic ball skills. This allowed the team to transform from ball chasing accustomed to an under 6/7 match at the start of the season to the positioning and attacking passing shown in the grand final.

I would also like to thank the parents of the team who ran training on the 2 occasions that I was unable to attend, set up our goals on a Saturday and showed their massive support for the team every week which made it feel like I had several managers rather than just parents. This was especially the case with Maria who generously supplied the team with half time watermelons and full time poppers which undoubtedly fuelled the team to play with high intensity in all our matches.

I genuinely hope all the players join me in coming back to play with your soccer friends next year as I know that somehow you will play better than this year and we will hopefully go one better than this year and get our first grand final win as a team.

Players in the team were:

Liam ARROZA: Liam returned for his second season in the team and was again the quickest player which made him an asset in defence to counteract the many quick players throughout the opposition teams. Liam fully committed himself to every challenge he made and executed his tackles brilliantly. He also learnt to attack in general play late in the halves to assist our tiring midfield and attacking players.

Rithul BASKARAN: A veteran of the team, Rithul returned for his third consecutive season. He was responsible for playing in centre midfield all season, the hardest position to learn, and did so

Towards the end of the season, Dante played more time as a striker and through his willingness to learn, he was able to patiently wait for the ball to be passed to him by staying with their last defender.

Mackenzie MAY: Mackenzie played in 2 matches throughout the year against Guildford (Red) and OLQP and was on the match card for 2 others against Kings (Blue) and Wentworthville. She proved to everyone that she was much more than just a number on the field, causing plenty of headache and embarrassment for the opposition defenders when they got outplayed by an under 7 player and was unlucky not to score against OLQP at Phillips Park at the canteen end where she got called offside. Thank you Mackenzie for helping our team throughout the year.

Zachary MAY: Another veteran of the team, Zac returned for this third season in a row. He is a very consistent, under rated defender much like myself. His experience meant he marked his opposition striker very tight, giving them no room to move with the pressure resulting in many successful tackles and many passes by the opposing striker that went to one of our players. Due to the depth of goalkeepers this year, Zac was not called upon to play in goals for the first time in three years!

Thanish MAYUTHARAN: One of three new players, Thanish was thrown in the deep end this season as I got him to play in most positions. To his credit he tried his best and when I took him off to talk about where I wanted him to play, he listened and asked questions with great maturity. Eventually Thanish settled in as one of our strikers and was a 'target man' for our midfielders to pass the ball to where he was in great field position to score his 2 goals for the season and assist many others. He also learnt to pressure mistakes from their defenders meaning we had more of the ball and more chances to score.

Paul MCGARVEY: The most improved player for this season, Paul returned from last year to once again play as a defender. As good as he was at defending last year, he was much more consistent this year and added to his craft by learning how to 'play out' from goal kicks by passing the ball to the midfielders as well as learning when to attack on corners and free kicks where he was unlucky not to score in a few matches.

Lucas QIU: Lucas returned from last year and was again always one of the first players at the park ready to play each week. This year he improved massively regarding how and when to pressure the opposition defenders into mistakes. This meant that whilst he didn't himself tackle many opposition players, his pressure on the ball meant that their passes were rushed and therefore inaccurate, often going straight to our players. A very underrated player who will be a very good distributor of the ball in attack when he improves his confidence on the ball.

Bahir SARWARI: Another veteran of the team, Bahir also returned for his third successive season. He learnt when to dribble and use his tricks to get past defenders and when to pass the ball with Rithul and Safal in the midfield to make progress towards the opposition goal. Bahir was our second highest goal scorer with 10 goals this season and had his best individual performance against OLQP where he carved up their defence by passing with Safal straight down the middle of the field to score himself 4 goals in the match.

Likhil Mahitej VALIVETI: One of three new players, Likhil impressed with his raw speed and gifted athleticism as a goalkeeper. For most of the season he shared goalkeeper duties with Dante and used his speed in the second half of matches to cause chaos in attack for the tiring defenders in the opposition where he scored 2 goals for the season. For our two knockout final matches however, he was given the massive responsibility to play in goals for the entirety of both matches where his athletic saves kept us in both matches which earned him player of the match for both of our knockout matches.
